Slow Down – Respect Your Neighbors!!!!!!!!!!!!!!

With alarming and increasing frequency, your Board is getting calls, emails and other contacts asking for help to slow down



their neighbors. Frankly, this is getting scary.

We no longer allow our kids to kayak in our canal anymore. Why? Neighbors are in such a rush to get out or in from the river, they drive dangerously fast around blind corners and only slow down when they get to their own dock. We see this **all** the time from our home. Worse, some boaters not only are driving way above idle speed with wake – they are obviously inebriated.

The situation has gotten so bad that residents have now almost come to blows accompanied with coarse language and calls to Lee County Sheriff.

Similarly, we have received data from Lee DOT on the speed of drivers in T&R. Some 30 percent of the cars clocked into and out of our community are driving at 35 mph and faster. The state speed limit is 25 in residential neighborhoods. We could easily argue for a lower limit.

I write this letter because in all cases, regardless of where anyone lives in Town & River, there is zero need for speeding - on the water or on our streets.

Canal speeds should be idle speed with no wake. Driving speeds are by law set at 25 mph - and less where blind corners exist or straightaways with many driveways, etc.

When you exceed these speeds, you are showing complete disrespect for your neighbors, their kids, their property and their safety.

I am asking that in the name of civility, please slow down. We all know our extra speed only gets us home or out shopping or to your dock or the river a few minutes guicker. And no sooner do you get to the river but you are in a manatee zone. Or at a traffic light.

Please, the last thing any of us want is a tragic accident. I fear this most every weekend. I never want to learn of a child or parent or someone walking their dog killed or injured in a T&R canal or street by a neighbor speeding. None of us want to be the cause of that life ending tragedy.

Please – put down that beer, slow down your boat. Take a few seconds more to get home. The drive into the furthest corners of Town & River is only a few seconds more at the legal speed limit.

Let's all respect our neighbors.

Approval Of Minutes – November 14, 2019 minutes were approved by motion as submitted.

Introduction Of New Board Member

Mark introduced Roy Benton who has offered to join the Board & was unanimously nominated. Roy has, for many years, built seawalls as his business & livelihood & is offering his expertise & knowledge to T&R. He will arrange for Engineer Hans Wilson to speak at the annual meeting regarding seawalls & they will both give an informative presentation. Roy noted the seawalls in T&R were built sixty or so years ago & are now inadequate.

Treasurer's Report – Mark Generales

Gary emailed November financial statements to Board Members earlier in the week. Mark noted 2020 Dues Invoices will be mailed following the annual meeting. Sally reported Lake Assessment Invoices were mailed today, December 12. The treasurer's report was approved

Lake - Renee Notes

Renee reported individual Insurance Companies inspect the lake seawall upon writing new/renewing policies and can cancel policies if necessary repairs to the seawall and seawall cap are not made.

Annual Meeting Preparations

The notice of the Annual Meeting mailing was mailed with proxies & return envelopes for the official election of Directors Rick Chubb & Joe Tomaino. The three appointees, Rick Chubb, Joe Tomaino & Roy Benton will be voted on at the annual meeting. The Board recommends dues remain at \$120 per year.

Architectural Review/Dor Discussion

Mark noted DOR Documents do not mention seawalls & do not address standards for seawalls within T&R. Roy noted Punta Gorda instituted a program whereas all owners pay \$450 per year as long as they own the property. If & when a seawall needs repair or replacement the project is completed at no additional expense to the homeowner. Roy will arrange a meeting with Punta Gorda officials to discuss this option, & in February have a T&R meeting to present details to owners.

Update On County Dot Paving – Mark Generales

Mark explained this is a 3-year project, & will be continued in the fall of 2020.

Adjournment

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned by motion at 7:35 p.m. The next regularly scheduled Board Meeting will convene 6:30 p.m. Thursday, January 9, 2020 at South Pointe South Clubhouse, 9734 Foxglove Circle, Ft. Myers.

Longtime resident Genevieve Bowen researched some of the area's oldest residents to obtain memoirs for the annual dinner, hosted by the Southwest Florida Historical Society.

Jennifer Stacey and Greg Parker of ABC-7 will be the storytellers for the evening, which brings together pioneers of Lee County along with newcomers who are curious about the area's past.

The presentation will be accompanied by music performed by Barbara Peterson at the piano with vocals by Roger Peterson, John Goulet and Beverly Cox.

In 1983 the SWFLHS received as a gift a building that was destined to be demolished for a new parking lot. Harper Brothers Construction donated the building and Flint and Doyle was contracted to move the building to the campus of the Lee County Alliance of the Arts. In 1984 the SWFLHS received its Articles of *Incorporation with the following purpose: "The mission* of the society is to discover, collect and preserve original and source documents, maps and photographs pertaining to the history of Southwest Florida; to bring together those interested in the history of this area; to promote and stimulate public interest and appreciation of the history of this area; and to further the preservation and knowledge of Southwest Florida's past."





Charitable Gifting Strategies

For many, the holidays are a time for giving back — whether by donating to a favorite charity or helping out a family member. Before you make a donation or gift, however, it's important to choose the right strategy, paying close attention to potential tax and legal implications.



Charitable Ciring

Charitable Giving

If there's a charitable organization you'd like to donate to, be sure to take the time to consider the charitable giving vehicle you'll use to make your gift. Let's look briefly at some of the options.



Outright gifts. Outright gifts of cash or property provide charities with immediate resources. Be sure to keep your receipts or bank records to validate any income tax deductions you wish to claim. Keep in mind that you may need a professional appraisal to qualify for a tax deduction on certain noncash contributions.

Donor-advised funds. A donor-advised fund is a charitable giving vehicle managed by a public charity for the purpose of distributing funds to other charities. When you contribute to a donor-advised fund, you can advise the charity on the grants it makes, as well as take advantage of possible tax deductions. Be aware, however, that there may be a minimum donation amount, and administrative fees may cut into the funds available for grants.

Charitable remainder trusts. With this type of trust, the donor receives income from the trust for his or her lifetime, the lifetime of another person, or a period of up to 20 years. At the end of the specified term, the remaining trust assets are distributed to a charitable beneficiary. The greatest benefit of a charitable remainder trust is that you can take advantage of immediate tax benefits while continuing to utilize the assets, as you may deduct the present value of the charitable remainder interest. On the downside, charitable trusts tend to be complex to set up and usually require legal and administrative support.

Charitable gift annuities. A charitable gift annuity is a split-interest gift made directly to a charity that provides you, your spouse, or a family member with fixed income payments for life. The charity typically ends up with about half of your donation, while you get an immediate tax deduction and some guaranteed income. Keep in mind that an annuity is a contract between you and the charity, and your return isn't guaranteed by the government.

Private foundations. A private foundation is a charity established by an individual, family, or corporation. Although it offers donors a great deal of control over their gifts, a private foundation can be costly to administer, and it must adhere to a strict set of rules designed to ensure that it carries out its charitable purpose.

Bequests. If you wish to give to charity posthumously, you may make bequests by way of your will, trust provisions, or beneficiary designations. Although bequests

offer simplicity and are easy to set up, they are not income tax deductible during your life.

Gifting To Family Members

Giving back doesn't always mean giving to charity. Gifting to family members can be just as rewarding, and it can be an effective way to transfer wealth while reducing or avoiding taxes. Here are several common strategies for gifting to family members:

- Making an outright cash gift. For tax year 2019, you may gift up to \$15,000 to any individual without tax consequences. (This amount increases to \$30,000 for married couples.) This limit will remain the same for tax year 2020. If you're sharing gifts with your spouse, or you'd like to gift more than this amount to one person, you'll need to file a gift tax return using IRS Form 709.
- Paying college tuition or medical bills directly. If you'd like to pay a family member's expenses directly to a school or health care provider, the \$15,000 limit does not apply. Plus, you're still free to give the individual a separate tax-free gift of up to \$15,000.
- Contributing to a 529 plan. With this strategy, you can contribute to a relative's qualified education expenses while paring down your own estate. Contributions to 529 plans grow tax deferred, and withdrawals for the beneficiary's education are tax free at the federal level (and usually at the state level, too). Additionally, 529 plans are eligible for a special exemption that allows you to gift up to five years' worth of annual exclusion contributions (i.e., up to five times \$15,000, or \$75,000, per person per year) without using any estate and gift tax exemption. You will need to file IRS Form 709 to document the transaction.

With all the options available, choosing the best way to give to charity or family members can seem overwhelming. Don't hesitate to reach out to your financial advisor to discuss various strategies and select an option that makes sense for you, your family, and your financial situation.
